

Reminder

Please ensure your child has **everything** with them when they come into school **every morning.** This includes packed lunch, water bottle, book bag, coat, afterschool club items etc. The office is very busy and your child's items will not be taken straight to their classroom. Thank you for your cooperation.

Coat/Water Bottles

Please can you ensure your child brings a named waterproof jacket to school each day. All children will go outside at break time/lunch time, unless the weather is particularly bad. All Reception children will spend a lot of time outside during the school day.



Reminder-Your child's water bottle must only contain water. Please do not send squash/juice as this will be disposed of.

Lost Property Box-Important

If your child has lost any items around school, please can you check the lost property box which is situated in the foyer at the front of the school.

Please ensure <u>you name all items of clothing/water bottles etc</u> and remove old name tags if you have purchased second hand uniform items.

Any items found around school/outside will be put in the wooden lost property box.

School Absence-Important Procedures

Please could all parent/carers ensure they let the office know every day that their child is unwell and the nature of the illness. Medical evidence may be required for absences longer than 5 days and when attendance falls below 90%.

Please also provide written proof of any appointments and advise whether your child will be requiring a school meal.

May we also remind you that if your child has vomiting and/or diarrhoea, you must wait 48 hours from the last episode before bringing your child back to school.

School Attendance—Reminder-School Day Start/Finish Times

Reception arrive between 8.50am to 8.55am and finish at 3.05pm

Y1 & Y2 to be ready and awaiting class teacher by 8.55am in the playground. Finish time is 3.15pm.

Please remember afterschool clubs finish at 4.15pm, with the exception of Baking Club which finishes at 4.30pm. Please arrive on time to collect your child and make sure that if your child has brought a bike or scooter to school that it is left at the front of the school.



Please note it is very disruptive for <u>all members of staff</u> when your child arrives late to school, especially the class teacher who has already explained the lesson to the children. Please assist us by ensuring your child is here on time.

We would also like to remind all parents that you <u>must call the school office each day</u> to report your child's absence. If we do not hear from you, it will be noted on our attendance register as unauthorised absence. Please note this forms part of our safeguarding procedure.

Cool Milk-Reception Children-IMPORTANT INFO

Please remember that all children under the age of 5 will receive free Government funded milk. When your child turns 5, or if they are already over the age of 5, you have the option to pay for their milk directly through Cool Milk.

If you would like your child to receive milk, then please visit <u>www.coolmilk.com</u> and select "register your child for milk here" then follow the on-screen instructions to register and pay.

Please be aware the cut off date is Tuesday for milk orders to commence the following week. All parent/carers must contact cool milk if they have any problems.

Important If your child is no longer wishing to have the milk that you are paying for, please log into your account with Coolmilk.com and cancel.

Dogs

Please be aware that dogs <u>must not</u> be brought anywhere onto the school grounds, this includes carrying them in your arms. Dogs must not be tied up at the school gate either.

Toys are not allowed in school. Toys are a personal item and there is a risk of them being lost or damaged and are a distraction in class.

School Meals-Important

Thank you to all those parents who have registered their child's lunch choices via Arbor. It would be helpful to remind your child each day what meal they will be having for lunch.

If your child is a vegetarian then you must request the vegetarian option.

The current menu will continue until October half term so please remember to add your child's lunch choices. If your child is bringing a packed lunch from home we still require you to add this in the system. Your child will be given the vegetarian if you do not allocate a choice of meal for them.

Remember your child must not bring any <u>nut</u> products or any food containing nuts to school. This also includes sesame /homous.

There will be a new menu from the 4th November.

If your child receives a specially prepared meal due to allergies then **we will submit their** meal code for them.

When your child starts or returns to school, they will have increased contact with other children. If they are not up to date with their routine immunisations, they may be at risk of catching preventable diseases, including measles, whooping cough, meningitis, diphtheria and polio.

Please check that your child is fully up to date with their routine immunisations before they start or return to school. You can check if your child is up to date with immunisations by checking their Red

or contacting your GP surgery. For a full checklist of vaccines and when they should be given visit - NHS vaccinations and when to have them.



ABOUT US

Hello! We are the team that run The Hygiene Bank project in Hampton. The Hygiene Bank is a people-powered charity that relies on local community volunteers like us.

Our aim is to tackle hygiene poverty by giving people in need access to hygiene basics - the everyday toiletries many of us take for granted.

WHAT IS HYGIENE POVERTY?

Hygiene poverty is not being able to afford everyday essential toiletries to keep clean. Imagine having to share your toothbrush or use washing up liquid to wash your body... The reality of low income is that it can leave people caught between being able to heat their homes, pay the rent, eat or stay clean.

STEP 1









Toiletries are donated by the public at our local drop off points.

Volunteers collect and sort the toiletries and allocate them to local charities and schools based on need.

Volunteers deliver the toiletries to the local charities and schools who then distribute these products to individuals and families living in hygiene poverty.
