The Importance of Good Attendance

At our school, we believe that every day matters. Consistent school attendance is vital for your child's success. Missing school means missing out on valuable learning opportunities, which can affect academic progress and confidence. Here's a closer look at how attendance impacts achievement:

96% - 100% Attendance

Excellent. Students in this category have excellent attendance, which puts them in a great position to meet or exceed their academic targets.

91% - 95% Attendance

This is a cause for concern. Missing 9-17 days a year can mean nearly three weeks of missed learning, which can make it harder to keep up.

Under 90% Attendance

This level is concerning and is not acceptable. A child with 80-90% attendance will have missed almost two months' worth of learning over the course of the year. This can create significant gaps in their knowledge, making it much more challenging for them to reach their goals.

There are winner and runner-up prizes for different age categories: 5-7 years, 8-11 years and 12-15 years, as well as prizes for the best work from each London borough. There'll also be a presentation ceremony at City Hall and all winning entries will appear in an exhibition in late spring.

This year, winning works from the age group categories will be created in 3-D and displayed in Trafalgar's Square's famous St Martin-in-the-Fields, Crypt, on the Children's Plinth.
