
The school as a whole is very welcoming. The multiple visits, school disco, attending the summer fair have really helped.

The HHJS Learning Experience




- Pupils are highly engaged in their learning.


Pupil Wellbeing

Admissions Criterion:

- 1. SEN* Place reserved for a child with an Education, Health and Care Plan
- 2. Looked after child (including previously looked after children)
- 3. Exceptional family, social or medical need
- 4. Having a brother or sister in the school or the paired school
- 5. Children of staff
- Distance of home address to school

The closing date for applications is **15th January 2025**.
